TRURO, NOVA SCOTIA — TREY [Trauma Recovery for Exploited Youth] confirms that Pam MacLeod has formally stepped down from the Board of Directors. Her decision reflects a shared commitment to clarity, stability, and the organization's forward direction. Her husband Kevin has not held any position or responsibilities within TREY's internal operations since the initial circumstances became known. Neither individual will have any involvement with TREY pending the resolution of the legal matters now before the court.

The board of directors of TREY has also retained GMFPartners.org, a professional advisory agency serving nonprofit clients across the Maritimes, to guide a strengthened governance framework, support a rebranding process, and help advance the organization's long-term structure and sustainability. This work is now underway.

Program Operations During Organizational Restructuring

TREY is currently in a period of organizational restructuring, strengthening its residential and outreach model to ensure that future programming serving exploited women reflects best practices in trauma-informed care. During this transition, TREY continues to provide essential community-based support through outreach, aftercare, safety planning, practical assistance, and connection to partner services.

Statement from the Executive Director

"This has been a period of important review for TREY. Since stepping into the role of Executive Director, our shared focus as an organization has been on strengthening our structure, governance, and long-term stability.

Our priority remains the safety, dignity, and support of the women we serve. We are deeply grateful to our donors, volunteers, and community partners who continue to stand with us as we move forward with renewed focus and a strengthened foundation. Our team is taking steady, responsible steps as we guide TREY into its next chapter of service."
